STAKEHOLDER CONSULTATION/SURVEYS/CASE STUDIES/INTERVIEWS

IN THE FRAMEWORK OF THE PILOT PROJECT ON SMART ECO-SOCIAL VILLAGES (AGRI-2017-EVAL-08)

1. OBJECTIVE

The objective of the consultation, conducted in the framework of the Pilot Project on Smart ecosocial villages, is to receive the views of stakeholders and to contribute to the Pilot Project's different Themes, under the responsibility of the Head of Unit F1 "Conception and consistency of rural development", Directorate-General for Agriculture and Rural Development, European Commission.

As this activity involves the processing of personal data, it is subject to data protection rules as established by Regulation (EC) $45/2001^{1}$.

2. WHAT PERSONAL INFORMATION DO WE COLLECT AND THROUGH WHICH TECHNICAL MEANS?

2.1. Identification Data

Personal data collected and further processed are only those data which are necessary for the management of contributions such as: First name, Family name, Name of Organisation, E-mail address, Country, as well as the views of contributors on the topics concerned.

The processing operations on personal data linked to the management of this consultation are necessary for the functioning of the Commission as mandated by the Treaties, and more specifically by Articles 5 and 13 TEU and Articles 244 - 250 TFEU

The lawfulness of processing is based on article 5(a) and (d) of Regulation 45/2001.

2.2. Technical information

The Contractor (Ecorys) will make use of the <u>Checkmarket</u> platform for the collection of views on the definition of "Smart Village", best practice examples and case study candidates. The Checkmarket platform is an online survey tool that allows for the creation and distribution of online surveys, and online collection of data. Stakeholders are invited

Regulation (EC) 45/2001 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 18 December 2000 on the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of personal data by the Community institutions and bodies and on the free movement of such data

to fill in the survey via an online link that will give access to the survey. Data collected via the survey will be transferable into a database, allowing for analysis of the data. The data collected via the Checkmarket survey tool is stored inside the EU, while a multi datacentre infrastructure is in place avoiding any risk of data loss.

3. WHO HAS ACCESS TO YOUR INFORMATION AND TO WHOM IS IT DISCLOSED?

Access to all personal data and information collected in the context of this Pilot Project is only granted through UserID/Password to a defined population of users, without prejudice to a possible transmission to the bodies in charge of a monitoring or inspection task in accordance with Community legislation. These users are typically members of the Unit organising the Pilot Project inside the DG, and its subContractor (Ecorys), acting as processor. No personal data is transmitted to parties which are outside the recipients and the legal framework mentioned. The European Commission will not share personal data with third parties for direct marketing purposes.

Personal data such as names and email addresses will not be published on the web or in the study. However, in the best practice examples and the case studies the names of the participating communities will be included. If contributors to these parts of the Pilot Project do not agree with any reference to their organisation, their names will not be mentioned. If you do not agree with this publication of your personal data, please opt-out where required or inform us using the Contact Information below.

4. How do we protect and safeguard your information?

The collected personal data and all information related to the above mentioned consultation is stored on a computer of the external Contractor, which has to guarantee the security and confidentiality of the collected information. Received contributions will also be recorded in a secured and protected database hosted by the Data Centre of the European Commission, the operations of which abide by the Commission's security decisions and provisions established by the Directorate of Security for this kind of servers and services. The database is not accessible from outside the Commission. Inside the Commission, the database can be accessed using a UserID/Password

- The collected personal data and all information related to the evaluation/study will be erased by the Contractor at the latest six months after the end of the contract.
